**ROBERT H. JACKSON CENTER AND PHILLIPS LYTLE LLP TO PRESENT WEEKLONG
CLE LECTURE SERIES AT CHAUTAUQUA INSTITUTION**

“Robert H. Jackson – His Legacy & Times” series being held June 30-July 4

BUFFALO, NY – Robert H. Jackson Center and Phillips Lytle LLP, one of the region’s largest full service law firms, will present a weeklong CLE lecture series, “Robert H. Jackson – His Legacy & Times,” being held at Chautauqua Institution June 30 – July 4, each morning from 9-10 a.m. at the Hall of Philosophy. Daily sessions will examine the career and life of Supreme Court Justice Robert H. Jackson.

Lecture topics include Jackson before Nuremberg, including a short exploration of the issues encountered by the Roosevelt administration after taking office at the height of the Great Depression; Jackson at Nuremberg, including an exploration of the first international criminal tribunal following the end of World War II and Jackson following Nuremberg which will address the critical court cases until his death in 1954. Monday and Tuesday lectures will be lead by Bruce Dierenfield, a professor of history at Canisius College. E. Barrett Prettyman, Jr., of counsel at Hogan & Hartson in Washington, D.C. and who served as a law clerk successively to U.S. Supreme Court Justices Robert H. Jackson, Felix Frankfurter and John Marshall Harlan, will lead the Wednesday session. Benjamin Davis, associate professor at the University of Toledo College of Law, will lead the Thursday session and Friday lecturer is John Q. Barrett, a professor of law at St. John’s University in New York City where he is currently writing the biography of Robert H. Jackson.

Course registration and a \$65 course fee is required and can be made through Special Studies at Chautauqua Institution at 716-357-6250. An academic credit as Professional Staff Development Certification for history teachers participating will also be awarded.
